Pubs and restaurants to open from 4 July

Pubs and restaurants are set to reopen from this Saturday bringing with it an al fresco culture which allows pubs to apply for a new pavement license.

These new measures are designed to support businesses selling food and drink such as cafes, pubs and restaurants by introducing a temporary fast-track process for these businesses to obtain permission, in the form of a "pavement licence", from their local borough or district council for the placement of furniture such as tables and chairs on the pavement outside their premises.

This will enable them to maximise their capacity whilst adhering to social distancing guidelines. The current process for businesses to obtain these licences can be costly and time-consuming.

The Bill includes temporary measures to place a cap on the application fee for businesses and enforcement powers so councils can protect public safety and amenity, and introduces a new 10 working day determination period, ensuring that businesses can obtain licences in a timely and cost-effective manner aiding to their financial recovery.

In making decisions about whether or not an establishment can have a pavement license the council will need to liaise with East Sussex Highways about how possible it is to maintain disabled access, whilst maintaining social distancing, which will be a mandatory condition.

The application will need to be advertised so that the public and other businesses can object.
