#### **General Election**

We processed 47,938 ballot papers and at 4.30am on Friday 5 July, Dr Kieran Mullan was declared the new MP for the Bexhill and Battle constituency.



#### Affordable homes at Blackfriars, Battle

The Council supported a new option for the development of affordable homes at Blackfriars, Battle to provide quality housing for residents in need.

#### Pension Credit campaign

We held a launch event for the new Rother BCP scheme, bringing together local businesses and the police to help tackle shoplifting crime.
