- **b. Cheques to be signed –** These figures were proposed by Cllr Nottage and seconded by Cllr Mrs Oliver. All members present agreed.
- Police Report: PCSO Georghiou reported that there had been no major incidents. There have been reports of scam mail, dog bites, 3 traffic accidents (no serious injuries), a missing person, firearm inspection and reports of a naked male! Next month officers will be issued with the new mobile devices which will allow paper work to be completed without having to go back to the police station.

PCSO Georghiou offered his apologies as he will not be able to attend the meetings in June and July.

Q: Can Speed watch operate outside the school? No problem as it is a designated site. Query regarding persistent parking on zigzag lines – unfortunately police cannot go out to deal with it.

With the agreement of the Cllrs item 9g on the agenda was brought forward.

- 21 Use of Community Hall by PCSO With the new technology it would be useful for the PCSO to have a base in the village. It was proposed by Cllr Mrs Collins and seconded by Cllr Mrs Pomeroy that the PCSO be allowed to use the Community Hall for lunch breaks and as a contact point for the village. All members present agreed.
- **Report/observations of District & County Councillor:** County Cllr Maynard is glad to be back, the turnout for the election was outstanding.

RDC annual meeting tomorrow. Some changes – Cabinet to comprise 5 rural members and 5 from Bexhill. Aim to protect Community Grants for this term. There are still pans for regeneration over the district.

ESCC – cuts of £70 – 90million will need to be made between now and 2020.

Work continues on the Link Road, it will open this year. There is a legal challenge to the Baldslow link (Hastings Borough Council), should start in 2016. Cllr Maynard still pressing not to close Maplehurst Road. Junction Road to be turned into a cycle route.

Council Tax – capping unlikely to change (i.e. under 2%). Greg Clark now Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government - fair to say that councils should get a fair deal.

- Q: The Council is not impressed with the results of the speed survey. Cllr Maynard will look for compromise. Should meet with Highways Steward on site.
- Q: What are the criteria for Community Grants? One off capital project for the village.
- Q: At the Annual Assembly PCC Katy Bourne was asked about parking on the pavement. Why does RDC have no parking wardens? RDC and Wealden do not have decriminalised parking if they did, there would have to be charges for street parking. This would become the responsibility of ESCC and would be very expensive to administer. It would probably not generate the same sort of income as Hastings for example.

RDC cannot afford to employ traffic wardens but if it did, they would probably not be used in the villages.

Cllr Mrs Oliver proposed that a letter be sent to the bus company asking for the start of this service to be re timed to 9.30am. This was seconded by Cllr Stone. All members present agreed.
- **Annual Assembly** Date set for Annual Assembly as 13th April 2016. Suggestions for speakers included RNLI, RSPB, RSPCA, Lydd Airport, Dungeness Power Station, Brede Giants, Bat Conservation and Fire Safety.
- **Set up Working Party for Vehicle count –** Cllr Came to coordinate.
- **Issues raised at Highways meeting** Setts replaced in Conservation Areas investigate the pros and cons of conservation areas.
- **Use of Community Hall by Clerk** It was proposed by Cllr Mrs Oliver that the Clerk uses the Community Hall as an office for 2 hours per week. This was seconded by Cllr

Fowler. All members present agreed.
