There is a large amount of bullying in the sector, and NALC, SLCC, and ESALC are encouraging Parish Councils to sign the Civility and Respect pledge. The latest newsletter with details has been circulated separately, and the pledge itself is

By signing the Pledge, your council is agreeing that the council will treat councillors, clerks, employees, members of the public, and representatives of partner organisations and volunteers with civility and respect in their roles and that it:

- · Has put in place a training programme for councillors and staff
- Has signed up to the Code of Conduct for councillors
- Has good governance arrangements in place including staff contracts and a dignity at work policy
- Will seek professional help at the early stages should civility and respect issues arise
- Will commit to calling out bullying and harassment if and when it happens
- Will continue to learn from best practices in the sector and aspire to be a role model/champion council through for example the local <u>Local Council Award Scheme</u>
- Supports the continued lobbying for change in legislation to support the Civility and Respect Pledge including sanctions for elected members where appropriate

Councillors need to consider whether to sign the pledge, or if anything else is needed first, such as a training programme policy. You already have the code of Conduct in place (on website if you need to look at it)

<u>Item 19</u>
