
Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) Report

Last month completed the 5th year of operation of the VAS. Over the previous twelve month surveys have been conducted using the Black Cat to monitor traffic flow and speed and compaired this data with that of the VAS over the same time period. This analysis is now complete with the exception of the months October, December and May.

It has been apparent 2017 that the VAS over reports and I have been reporting the actual VAS values and the calibrated values. From now on I will report the calibrated values only and reflect these values in the charts. I will also include a chart for the number of excessive speeding vehicles.





Black Cat Traffic Monitoring Device

During the period two week long Black Cat traffic monitoring sessions have taken place, one at Two Hoots (adjacent to the VAS), and one opposite Jempson's along Tanhouse Lane. The former was the VAS calibration for this month's VAS data and the latter was to confirm the previous month monitoring at the same location. The new battery lasts for the full week even though it is a smaller capacity than the original.

Of the four new monitoring point licences requested only the one for Brickfields was granted.
