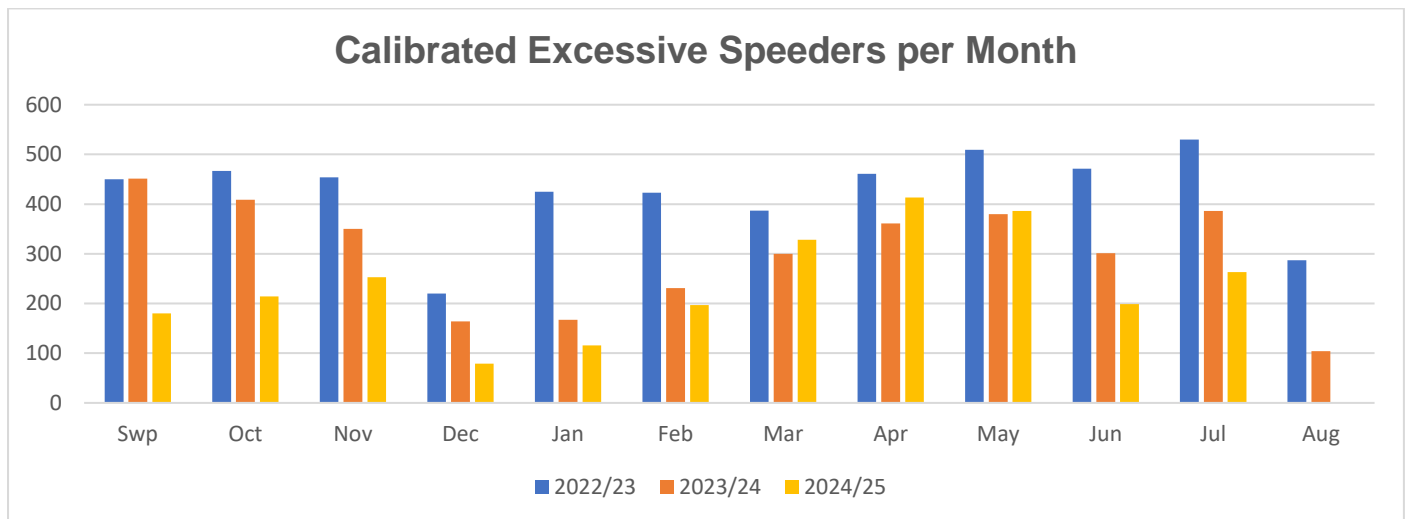
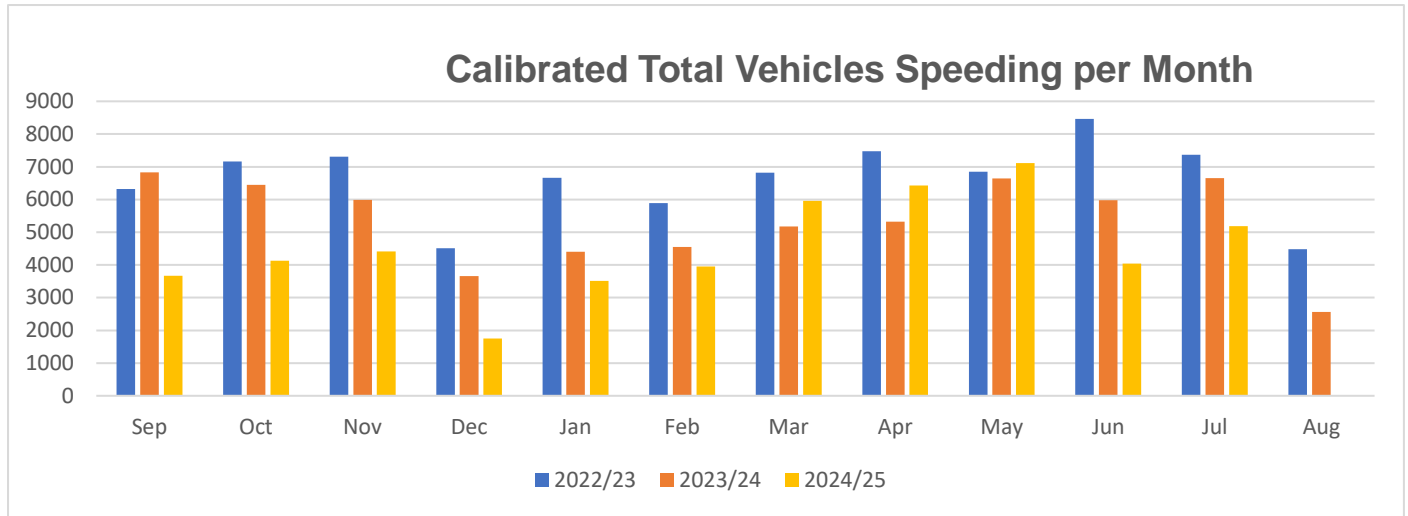


## Village Traffic and Roads Report

### Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) Report



The VAS recorded 31863 speeding vehicles in July of which 1939 were speeding excessively. VAS calibration values that were determined for July last year were used this year; the values being 6.14 for speeding vehicles and 7.35 for excessive speeding, resulting in 5189 speeding of which 263 were excessive.

There was a decrease in recorded speeding vehicles of some 22% and excessive speeder by 31.8%. This reverses the trend of the previous three months.

### Black Cat Traffic Monitoring Device

There were no Black Cat monitoring sessions during July.

### Speed Watch

There were two speed watch sessions this month, the results of which are detailed below.

The session on 11/07/25 was carried out in response to the Police's wish for a day of action. On this day across Sussex there were 110 monitoring sessions which resulted in 1640 speeding vehicles being recorded. The police also

visited 30 CSW groups that day, Peasmarsh was not one of them as we had a visit the week before; however, Beckley did receive a visit.

Edward Tuddenham , one of the original members of the group, received a recognition award for services from the police. The ceremony was conducted at the bus stop outside the village hall. The session was marred by a local residence who remonstrated with the policeman passionately about the fact that they were using volunteers to carry out the task and not themselves.

At the session on the 11<sup>th</sup> this same resident challenged the group about doing sessions in a threatening manner. This was passed to the police and as a result the group will be issued with a body worn camera.
