RALC Report April 2021

Potholes:

We have completed 2,416 carriageway pothole repairs between 01 January and 31 March in Rother, Bexhill, St Leonards and Hastings.

The Stewards and maintenance teams continue to be out on the Network completing inspections, repairs and responding to customer reports. Site meetings are now possible with the easing of restrictions but these will be limited to individual meetings with social distancing and PPE required, unless exempt. The team are continuing to attend SLR meetings remotely.

The spray patcher has been carrying out pothole repairs alongside our standard maintenance teams across the County.

Black Cat Radar:

Black cat radar devices will only be approved for use within 30mph speed limits, please assess the suitability of the locations prior to submission and ensure your risk assessments and method statements cover the activities you will be carrying out on the highway network. Location details need to be specific and include information on exactly which highway assets the device will be attached to. *FOR INFORMATION - Terminal Speed Limit signs and Give Way and Stop Signs cannot be used.* £10 million PLI will be required and an individual assessment will be made based on the site information as to whether a streetworks accredited contractor is required for every installation and removal of the devices.
